One area that stands out as having room for improvement is Court Availability with only 38% of respondents rating this as “Terrific” or “Good”.

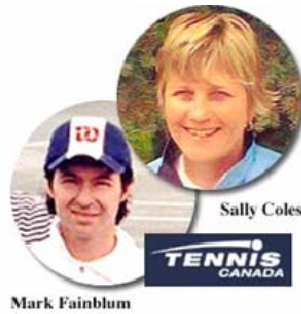

Pro's Corner



Tips For Parents of Junior Players

As kids tend to progress in sports, a lot of their success and future enjoyment depends on their relationship with their parents. Starting out, it is usually quite easy as expectations are not as high and most kids through proper instruction start to really get into the game. As a child starts to progress and they get introduced into tournament play, here starts some of the danger in the relationship between parent and child. Competitive play should be a positive experience for your child as she/he develops skills for the rest of their life, for example, how to work hard, how to focus, how to deal with losing and winning, and how to control many of the emotions that are associated with playing. For some parents, it is very hard to watch their child compete as they become too emotionally involved themselves and usually don't notice how they unintentionally put pressure on their child in a game that is supposed to be fun. This can slowly lead to a negative experience for both parent and child. Here are some tips on how to avoid this pitfall:

- remember why your child started to play the game in the first place - to have fun and to be active
- always communicate with your child, making sure that they tell you how they feel and are not afraid to do so
- as you get emotionally excited while your child is competing, always put things in perspective and look for the basic fundamentals like is my child working hard, is my child behaving and showing true sportsmanship
- be true to yourself - many parents tend to say "I don't care if you win as long as you work hard", however they don't notice how they themselves act and behave while their child is competing especially when losing

- give your child a chance to think independently since we all learn from our mistakes and experiences

As long as you help your child build confidence, develop strong work ethics and respectful behavior, tennis will always be a great vehicle in your child's future development as a successful human being.

Starting Out On The Court

Having youngsters enjoy their first tennis experience is paramount to growing a love for the sport. Creating an interest and fuelling the desire to improve one's skills leads to a child who takes a personal interest to work hard at his or her chosen sport. Introducing your child to a variety of sports at an early age also helps to improve their gross motor skills. Speed, agility and flexibility are important attributes when learning tennis. Hand-eye co-ordination can be practised by simply throwing, catching and kicking balls around. For early development the sponge balls and low density tennis balls are great for starting out as is scaling down the court. Improving skills at any level takes enormous effort, time and patience. It is not always easy to play tennis with your youngster as it takes a great amount of ball control to enable both of you to achieve success. A fun, positive tennis environment will lead to less frustration and more fun for everyone. Enjoy your time with your youngster on the court and hopefully they will love to play with you for many years to come.

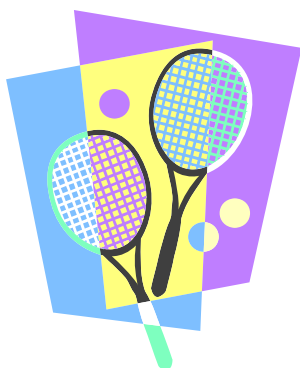
